It was good to see everyone at Mid-Winter. I know I always come away with a new spirit and I'm energized after getting to see all my brothers and sisters. I hope everyone was able to come away with something new that they didn't know before.

I know we all concentrate on what is going on at our nation's capital; but don't forget our great state of Texas. If you want to keep up on what our state is doing for our veterans, please visit: house.texas.gov website. It is full of all sorts of information.

On the national front we have had some very exciting legislative victories like the passage of the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, known as the PACT Act.

This historic, comprehensive legislation expands health care for generations of veterans who previously had to prove their conditions or illnesses were the result of service-connected exposure to toxic substances or environments.

It includes VA provisions for 23 presumptive conditions for rare respiratory diseases and cancers, and creates a framework for the establishment of future presumptions of service connection related to toxic exposure. We have also had the passage of the *PAWS for Veterans Therapy Act* which will establish a pilot program on dog training therapy for veterans diagnosed with PTSD and require VA to provide service dogs for those veterans, including veterinary insurance.
