We know we sent the following out in an email, but the information is too important not to share again. The VFW has issued a Claim Shark factsheet for you to share with fellow Veterans and social media communities. A Claim Shark is an individual or company that charges hefty fees to "assist" or "consult" Veterans with filing their VA benefit claims. This practice is illegal! Like the VFW said last year during testimony before Congress, "In our opinion, any group that fails to adhere to VA's well-established standards of accreditation and fee arrangements should be met at the door by Capitol Police, not offered a seat at the same table as hard-working, VA-accredited advocates who are held to professional and ethical standards designed to protect Veterans." Wow the holidays are behind us and a new year has started, welcome to 2024. Hope that you and yours received many blessings in the holiday season.

Mid-Winter Conference is scheduled for later this month. Here is a chance to learn more about the programs we have been working so hard on this year. More hard work needs to continue for the remainder of the year. Thanks for all that have been done to this point. We want to continue to be the “wind beneath our veterans' wings” and help Texas shine as always.

Remember we have Auxiliary Continuing Education for members, their spouses and children. This is a written entry of 300 words or less received by National on or before February 15, 2024. These written entries are submitted to National and not to me. This date is coming up quickly. The goal is to have 23 entries for Texas. The Scholarship amount to be awarded in each of the four conferences is \$1250.00. That amount of money can pay for books, labs and other fees.

Don't forget that this program continues with Young Patriotic Art and 3-Dimensional. Follow the guidelines in the Program Book starting on page 62. You may also find more information on MALTA under Scholarship. Page number 53 of the National Program has changed. There has been a change to the amounts given at National for art. Second place has increased to \$1,500. The local Auxiliary must receive art pieces by March 31. It has been pointed out to me that March 31 is a holiday. The Auxiliary at the local level can request that entries be to them earlier than that date.

Remember art must be in my hand no later than April 15. Districts can hold judging for art pieces but it is not required. Please continue to send the Escrow money for art at the National Level. This helps to increase prize money for the winners. Promote art contest through the same channels that were used for Voice of Democracy.

Remember, we are asking that Auxiliaries donate monies to create a Department Award for 2- and 3-Dimensional Art. The goal is to have awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places that total amount for this year \$1,000.00. Thank you in advance for this. We know that we have asked a lot this year. You may contact me for any help or explanations that you might need.
