Ask yourself if you've done all you can to bring more male members into our organization. Check with former members and encourage them to rejoin. Seek out Post members and ask them to inspire their eligible family and friends to join. Keeping our eyes open all the time for new members is vital as is retention of those we have.

LEGISLATIVE

In last month's “Our Two Cents” article, we discussed the Priority Goal of Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs. We will now examine the goal of Education, Employment and Transition Assistance.

In response to the dire economic consequences produced in the United States brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic, the VFW has not only recognized but they have addressed the fact that the Veterans have not been spared this harsh reality.

The VFW's Solutions:

- Congress must pass the Veterans Economic Recovery Act, which would create a rapid retraining program to provide certain veterans and reservists with 12 months of benefits to pursue training in high-demand occupations.
- Congress must pass legislation that would establish a fourth administration in VA, the exclusive focus of which would be economic opportunity benefits.
- Congress must pass legislation to permit veterans to receive an automobile grant every ten years in an amount equal to the grant maximum at the time of vehicle replacement.

The vast majority of veterans do indeed seek meaningful employment, education or job training. Accordingly, a fourth administration must be established in VA to properly address veterans' economic opportunity benefits utilization and growth and the improvement thereof. In turn, the new Under Secretary for Economic

Opportunity would have the authority to refocus resources, independently promote these programs to veterans and create a central point of contact for veterans organizations and Congress.

When you visit your congressional representatives, please stress these are the issues we will be fighting for in the 117th Congress. These goals reflect the resolutions passed and supported by the men and women of the VFW and its Auxiliary. To find out who your congressional representatives are, visit vfw.org/ActionCorps. The (5) Essentials of an Auxiliary:

1. Hold a least (10) business meeting.
2. Dues paid by at least 10 members on or before February 1.
3. Quarterly audits submitted.
4. Officers, elected, installed and reported to National.
5. President/Treasurer bonded by August 31.

District Presidents: Please follow up with Auxiliaries and make sure that bonds are completed, audits are up to date and membership is being worked.

Official visits within the district should be well under way and reports being sent on the visits. If during the visit, an Auxiliary is observed to be struggling, please note those areas somewhere on the official visit report form.

An Auxiliary can find a lot of information on the resource page located on the National Auxiliary website. Encourage auxiliaries to visit the resource page – under Chief of Staff and see what information is available.

National Ambassador Leona McDermott focuses on key points within her program. Suspension is one of those points.

Suspensions are used in certain cases to give an auxiliary and its' members the chance to fulfill duties and continue with their mission of serving Veterans, service members and their families.

If an Auxiliary is placed on suspension – this is not a negative. It does not label the Auxiliary as a bad auxiliary. It simply means that there is some work that the Auxiliary needs to take care of which will allow the Auxiliary to get to where it needs to be.

School is in full swing, and our deadlines for Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen are fast approaching. You can still GET THE WORD OUT! There is a tiny bit of

time left. A few groups that might be interested in what you have to say might include: Schools and JROTC Units • Church or youth groups • Youth-focused organizations • Home school associations • Parent-Teacher associations • Youth sports teams. Consider hosting a meet and greet for their local school district superintendent, principals, teachers and youth leaders in their communities. This will give them an opportunity to share information about our Scholarships and Youth Activities Programs and excite the community's leaders about the amazing opportunities we offer. Remember to collect those entries by October 31 and then get your winners to your district committee by November 15. Work closely with your VFW counterparts.

Remember, each Art entry must be accompanied by the Contest Application. Students MUST state the source of their idea for entry: magazine, TV, newspaper, etc. To comply with copyright laws, all artwork must be original to the entrant (No use of molds unless the student made the mold). Artwork may be inspired by other artist's/photographer's work, but not to the degree that the new piece of artwork is easily recognized as being a derivative of the other artist's work. If another artist's/photographer's work is used as a source of inspiration or reference, a copy of the work must be provided along with the name and date of publication in which it was found. Any artwork that is recognized as being in violation of these rules will be disqualified.

Be sure to plan a local awards program for all who participated in these programs. A nice recognition for the teachers who encouraged the students to participate would be nice as well.

Don't forget to send me your report for all the time you have spent getting this information out to the schools, recruiting judges, setting up a location for the judging and overseeing these functions. These reports are used to maintain the non-profit status of both the VFW and Auxiliary, so please REPORT.

Even though our focus is Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen right now, don't forget Student Patriotic Art and Continuing Scholarship. Those deadlines are not far off.

Robyn Kuznik 2021-2022 National Hospital Ambassador, in her BLOG www.vfwauxiliary.org/blog Honors Escort Program & National Suicide Awareness Prevention Month, **What is an Honors Escort**

Program? stated that “there are 464,687 Veterans projected to die this year outside of VA medical facilities. Many of these Veterans will receive hospice care in the community. To learn what the VA and National Hospice and Palliative Care is doing for veterans in community facilities access the website www.wehonorveterans.org.

We Honor Veterans recognizes the unique needs of America’s Veterans and their families. They empower hospice and community organizations to meet the unique needs of Veterans by offering guidance and resources focused on respectful inquiry, compassionate listening and grateful acknowledgment for a peaceful ending of life. The We Honor Veterans program is provided at no cost to hospice organizations.

Get involved! Now is our time to brainstorm ideas about ways we can engage staff in an end-of-life Honors Escort. As VFW Auxiliary members, lets spread the word about why this type of honor is important.”

Idea: Let’s make sure we are prepared! Have a family member of the Veteran call and speak with the Facility Director to inform them of the veteran status, as this question is not on most admitting forms and to personally request an Honors Escort, to by pass HIPPA /Confidentiality issues.

Educate the staff in the end-of-life protocol for our Nations Heroes with the Honors Escort Program and offer to donate a 5x9 flag for your Veterans use. Speak with local Veterans Organizations about donating flags.

It’s time to promote the VFW Auxiliary community Veteran’s Day & Christmas Card Drive. Ask a retail store that sells cards if you can put out a drop box so a customer can purchase a card, fill it out and drop it in the box service and the VFW Auxiliary will make sure they are collected and distributed to Veterans for the appropriate Holiday. Ask Youth Organizations to make or donate cards for their community outreach/service.

VAVS Representatives meet with the Medical Center’s Chief of Voluntary Service for an annual Joint Review (AJR) in November of each year and the VAVS Representative and Deputy Representatives will participate.

The Department Hospital Chairman may also be invited.

Reviews must be received by VFW National Headquarters no later than January 15, 2022.

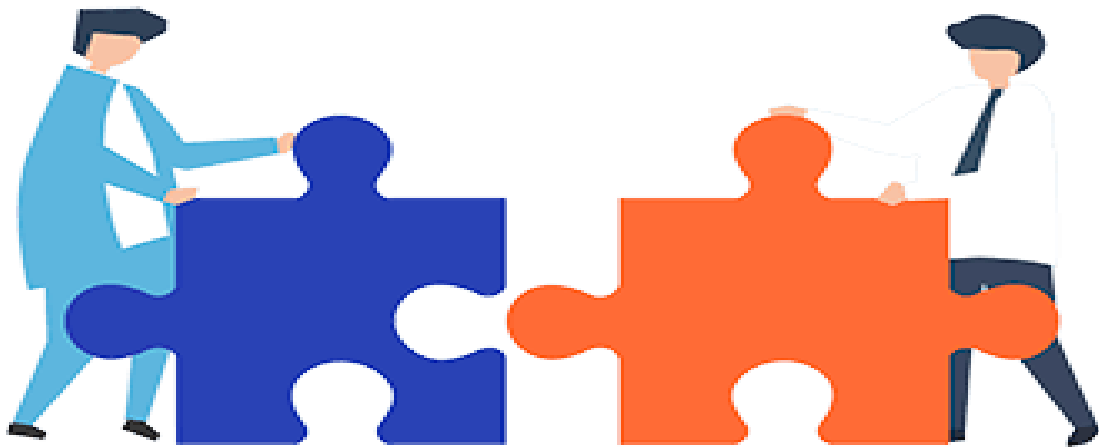
