The first article in the VFW Legislative Priorities is to prevent suicide by sharing the VA information. What does "entitled" mean? VA will collect data all throughout the state of Veterans suicides and the rates and with that being said, they're trying to figure out a way to prevent suicide amongst the Veterans. The VFW is developing an "after action" to push the VA to move forward. The VA will need to identify the study and the information regarding the economics opportunities in the benefits of the suicide of Veterans. This is what sums up what this action is.

The other after action is to pass TAP Promotion Act. The promotion act is to require incredible representatives from National and State in local organizations to be included in tact classes. Transitioning from service can be difficult, but they're trying to get more information and resources out to troops everywhere. If we don't get this information out there to them, how else are they going to get it? It is our job and our duty to serve these Veterans and their family members especially when they come back from a war and they don't understand what goes on and when they transition into civilian duty. We need to help these people as much as possible. We can only help them is to have information available for the service member and their family support team.

Please keep in mind, you were in their shoes once if not a Veteran - but a family member-we've all been there. We've seen the struggle! Let's help support our Veterans and their families during this difficult time.

Keep up the reporting! You are doing a great job. I'll see each of you soon.

Please make sure you attach copies of promotional materials and pictures and all the wonderful things that helped you make and promote your movie to your Year-End Report. We haven't asked for monthly reports or even a Mid-Year as we monitor membership through MALTA. Now, we need you to report what you have done in this program all year by 10 April 2024.

There are a few questions we should address:

Should we hold deceased members? Absolutely not! We are to report all deaths as they occur. I know many of you feel this will hurt your obtaining 100% in membership. If it does, then we haven't been recruiting, working the program and trying to grow. We have had one Auxiliary discover that they have many on their roster that were not reported and the likelihood of their being deceased for a decade or more is probable.

Taking Life Membership payouts for a member that is deceased and unreported is fraud. We should strive to make our 100% in membership honesty and with integrity.

Can the Investigating Committee meet at a time other than the regular meeting night? Yes! The membership presented at the meeting should have been investigated fully and signed by the committee prior to the meeting. If there are any questions concerning the application, it shall be held until the next meeting. (Bylaws, Article I, Section 102, Id)

What happens if we do not make 100%? You'll continue to work. Deadlines are for awards. Growth is ongoing. We need to continue to work on growth. There are several instances in which an Auxiliary must make corrections or "clean the roster".

Our membership numbers are important because Congress listens to the 1 million plus members of the VFW and its Auxiliary. However, that number needs to be accurate, not only to do the right thing by the member and the Veteran they honor by joining our ranks, but because we are an honorable organization

that should always strive to preserve our integrity in everything we say and do.

As we prepare for the curtain call and to sit back and watch the movies you have all created in your communities, remember that you matter.

Membership is all about us.
