You have gotten the entry forms to schools, art and music teachers, Auxiliary members and into the community by postal mail, email, social media, phone contacts and sharing with friends. Children ages 6-16 can participate in **Get Excited for the Red, White and Blue** by singing "The Star-Spangled Banner" using the exact words to the song. Their video entries to the local auxiliary should be received by March 31, 2021. Each auxiliary then conducts the judging and submits one winner to me by April 15, 2021.

Illustrating America has the same deadlines. Entries to the local auxiliary should be received by March 31, 2021. You select the first-place winner in each of the 3 age groups (grades 1-2, 3-5 and 6-8) and send to me by April 15, 2021.

LEGISLATIVE Tammie Mosby – Chairman

Wow! Where has the time gone? We are already through the first half of the year. It was good to see everyone at Mid-Winter and for those of you who couldn't attend, we sure missed you.

I just want to congratulate again District 14 for submitting the most word search puzzles. I know that Madam Department President was happy to see that \$75.00 go to her special project.

The President signed into law a very important piece of legislation: <u>H.R. 7105</u>, *Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020.* This legislation includes several VFW-supported bills that were pending in the 116th Congress. The enactment of this veterans' legislation package satisfies a number of VFW resolutions and legislative priorities regarding women veterans' health care, disability assistance and memorial affairs, and economic opportunity issues.

The House and Senate passed <u>H.R. 6395</u>, *National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2021* (NDAA), over a presidential veto. This law will add bladder cancer, hypothyroidism, and parkinsonism to the VA's list of presumptive conditions associated with exposure to Agent Orange.

The VFW wishes to thank our members and advocates who contacted their members of Congress regarding this very important provision. We also thank the members of Congress who voted to expand care and benefits to veterans who were exposed to Agent Orange. If you need help filing a VA claim for disability compensation, please <u>contact a VFW Service Officer in your state</u>. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many VFW service offices remain in a telework capacity, but the VFW's network of service officers have the capability to continue assisting our veterans safely without face-to-face contact.

The above is just one example of how we make a difference. Without our comrades, brothers and sisters of the VFW and Auxiliaries contacting your members of Congress this would not be possible. Your voice matters.

I want to remind everybody to be sure each auxiliary member is receiving the Action Corps Weekly enewsletter. You can sign up online to receive this resource at <u>www.vfw.org/advocacy/grassroots-effort</u>. You can also go to the resource page in Malta under Legislative to find more tools and resources.

Please be sure you read your program books and follow the guide lines set out for our National and State priority goals. Remember there are things that we do in our daily lives that we can be reported on. Things do not have to be done as a group, each individual can report. This is one of the ways we as auxiliary members have **Honor**, **Courage**, **Commitment for Our Veterans** as we are **Honoring Our Mission to Serve Veterans**.
