#### SCHOLARSHIP Annie Nickerson - Chairman

As we have left the winter behind, just a few reminders as our Young American Creative Patriotic Art Scholarship comes to a close. The first-place winner from each state competes for national awards totaling over \$33,000.

**Patriotic Art: Who is Eligible to Apply**: Any student in grades 9-12 who is enrolled in a public, private, or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools • Maximum student age of 18 at time of local entry. • Student must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. national. • Applicant does not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member in order to participate.

**Requirements**: Art must be on paper or canvas. Water color, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, marker or other media taught may be used. •

Digital art, jewelry, and photography are <u>NOT</u> <u>ACCEPTED</u>. • Submit canvas entries on stretcher frames or canvas board; other entries must be matted on white. Do not use colored mats. Reinforce the back with heavy paper. Mounted and floating mats may also be used. • Do not frame two-dimensional pieces. • Art should be no smaller than 8" x 10" but no larger than 18" x 24," not including the mat. Three-dimensional art can be paper, paper-mache, pottery, clay, metal work, fabric, etc. • Pieces should be no smaller than 8" in any direction and no larger than 24" in any direction. • Art cannot weigh more than 5 lbs.

The student should submit a typed explanation of patriotism expressed in art (150 words or less). Complete the entry form and attach to the back of the entry. Make sure that <u>ALL required SIGNATURES</u> are there.

Be sure the student has the name and contact information of the person they submitted their artwork to at the local VFW Auxiliary and that the auxiliary has theirs. Deadlines: Young American Creative Patriotic Art due locally by March 31: VFW Auxiliary and District Judging Complete and entry **received** by me by April 15.

District Chairman/District President, to make sure I have received your art work, send it requiring a signature for delivery. Also, make sure that your art is packaged properly so that it will arrive in good shape. If it is 3 dimensional, please <u>OVERpack</u> it to ensure its safe arrival.

National President's Special Project: Fund the Future: Since our National President's goal is to increase the awards for Continuing Education Scholarship and the number and awards for Patriotic Art, we need your help. Please make whatever monetary contributions you can. Contributions can be made through Malta.

In addition, if you have not worked your statewide project for the Endowment Fund, you are running out of time. Since this is an auxiliary project, be creative in your efforts. Some suggestions might be: Host a paint night with wine and hors d'oeuvres

- •Host a craft night
- •Raffle a quilt or handmade items

•Host a gallery night for local artists to show and sell their pieces

•Host a gallery night for local students to show off their work

•Hold an auction of donated items from local artisans

•Auxiliaries near the beach could host a sand castle contest. Auxiliaries can also do some of the traditional fundraisers such as raffles, dinners, bake sales, etc., but wouldn't it be more fun to be creative and try something new?! Let your imagination lead the way. I look forward to your monthly and year-end reports. Remember that all end of year reports is due to your District President by April 10.

As we March into spring and around the corner of our VFW year, here are a few of our recent Legislative Victories which Include:

- Implementation of VA's maternity care coordination program to equip community care providers with training and support for the unique pregnancy and postpartum needs of women veterans.
- Passage of the PAWS for Veterans Therapy Act which will establish a pilot program on dog training therapy for veterans diagnosed with PTSD and require VA to provide service dogs for those veterans, including veterinary insurance.
- Inclusion of bladder cancer, hypothyroidism, and parkinsonism to the list of Department of Veterans Affairs presumptive conditions for herbicide exposure.
- Passage of the Deborah Sampson Act, which will remove the barriers to health care impacting women veterans.
- Elimination of the 12-year limit on using Veteran Readiness and Employment (VR&E) benefits.

Among the VFW's most recent and important legislative victories was expanding college education benefits for military service members with the signing of the Forever GI Bill, and ensuring America's service members and veterans receive the care they deserve whenever and wherever they need it - by passing the VA MISSION Act.

The above information was taken directly from the enewsletter and from the Action Corps bulletins that come to your email weekly. That's how easy it is to stay informed and up-to-date on where and how the VFW is advocating on behalf of our veterans to obtain all of the benefits they have earned and are entitled to receive. Make spending a few minutes weekly with each of the publications a priority goal, so that you too can be informed and abreast of all the updates and important issues that affect our veterans. Share this resource and make sure that others are signed up to receive these important notifications.

If each auxiliary would make sure that all of their members are signed up and sign up 5 new ones, we will have furthered the mission of advocating for our nation's heroes.

Report all activities and meetings attended. We were reminded at Mid-Winter by Madam Past National President Sissy Borel, that our attendance at the training counted as a reportable activity for the Legislative Program. Please do send in those reports, don't let that be a missed opportunity. Now is the time to circle back and report on those activities that may have been done but not reported.

Year-End Reports are due to your District Presidents by April 10, 2022 and forwarded to the Department Chairman by the District Presidents by April 20, 2022. I continue to receive wonderful reports and some pictures accompanying. Wherever possible please do include pictures with your reports. Consult your program books for the categories for awards and work on the Statewide project. I look forward to seeing you all in action.
