

March will bring the deadline(s) for our **Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest**, open to 9th-12th grade high school and home schooled students. Entries submitted to Auxiliary by – **March 31, 2020**, local Auxiliary winners to District (if applicable) – **on or before April 10, 2020** with District Judging completed and the winner submitted to Dept. Scholarship Chairman - **by April 15, 2020**. My address can be found in our Program book or is available from your District President. Please send all packages **'signature required'**. It is essential that we teach, remind, and practice these principles of flag etiquette, American customs, traditions, and patriotic values of our country. No one is exempt. Everyone, young and old, should be reminded of our duty to respect our nation's flag. As Auxiliary members, we have a responsibility to create opportunities to provide instructional resources to our youth by visiting classrooms with our veterans, helping students learn about the Constitution, teaching the Pledge of Allegiance and presenting is also known as Washington Birthday flags to local schools. Our youth today is our future for tomorrow. In the past six months, I have submitted information for you to share. My question to you, “Have you shared this information with your auxiliaries, your schools, your local business organizations to name a few?”

All Americans should know the meaning of the flag draped coffin. Did you know the 21 gun salute stands for the sum of the numbers of the year 1776? Did you know the honor guard at military funerals folds the United States Flag 13 times? The following explains to you what each fold represents:

The 1st fold – Symbol of life

The 2nd fold – Symbol of the belief in eternal life

The 3rd fold – In honor and remembrance of the veterans

The 4th fold – Trusting in God for His divine guidance in times of war and peace

The 5th fold – Tribute to our country

The 6th fold – Where peoples' hearts lie when they say Pledge of Allegiance

The 7th fold – Tribute to the Armed Forces

The 8th fold – Tribute to the one who entered the valley of the shadow of death

The 9th fold – Tribute to womanhood and mothers

The 10th fold – Tribute to Fathers

The 11th fold – Represents the seal of King David and God of Abraham

The 12th fold – Emblem of eternity and God the Trinity

The 13th fold – Reminder of our nation's Motto, “In God We Trust”

After the flag is completely folded, it resembles the cocked hat of all the members of Armed Forces of the United States wear. When you attend a military funeral, remember the folds of the flag and its deep meaning and share this with your children, grandchildren, your auxiliary, and anyone that you are around. We live in the greatest nation in the world and we should be even more proud of our veterans who serve to protect our God-given rights and freedoms. Remember, we are the Voice of our Veterans - not an Echo and always, serve our veterans with Aloha with welcoming arms and warm hearts.

On the third Monday in February is Presidents Day in honor of our Presidents. This patriotic holiday is also known as Washington's birthday, in honor of our first President of the United States. Celebrate and honor this day with your Auxiliary.

NATIONAL HOME

Many veterans suffer during this time. Families also suffer when their veteran is not feeling the Christmas spirit. Please educate and promote the National Home *Helpline*. Encourage those in need to call 800-313-4200. Remember this is a *helpline* not a *hotline*. Be heard, be helped. All calls are answered and no caller is turned away. This free service offers information, creates connections and gives hope to struggling military and veteran's families. This helpline is answered by experienced problem-solvers who care deeply about veterans and their families and who have the contacts and knowledge needed to get each caller help. Sometimes an American hero just needs to be heard. Especially this time of year when depression can set in. There are various triggers to this feeling:

- Finances – Not enough money to buy gifts which leads to guilt.
- Stress – Not enough time to do everything that is expected of you during this season: dinners, parties, shopping and just being tired.
- Loneliness – 43% of Americans are single, with 27% living alone. 17% of singles are over 65 when health, age and mobility can make it more difficult to enjoy them self.
- Grief – Missing a deceased loved one. Seniors have more reasons to grieve.
- Estrangement – When you are not speaking to a relative, family get-togethers can bring feeling of sadness.
- Divorce – Especially difficult when adult children need to balance holiday visits.
- Pleasing – Trying to make everyone happy.
- Sadness – Gloomy weather and decreased sunlight can lead to Seasonal Affective Disorder.

Promoting this helpline may save a veteran and their family in time of need.

*****Secretary Notes*****

IMPORTANT!!!! It is almost time for Delegates— DO you want a vote in your District, Department and National levels? Start planning NOW! DISTRICT--- Have you paid all dues to District? Please read section 303 Auxiliary Delegates. You MUST elect at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary held not less than 30 (thirty) calendar days prior to the District Convention at which District officers are to be elected.

1 Delegate and 1 alternate for each 15 members or fraction thereof in good standing in the Auxiliary at the time of the election of Delegates. The Auxiliary Secretary SHALL send the names of the Delegates and the alternates to the District Secretary prior to the District Convention.

What this all means is look at the DATE of your District Convention and ensure that you back up 30 days to the month that you may need to elect District

delegates. You may have to vote in FEBRUARY if your convention is in April. Do not be caught without a vote!

NOTE 2!!! District delegates are NOT the same as DEPARTMENT DELEGATES. I will be sending out DEPT Delegate strength and dept dues amount after March 1st. Your number of delegates will be different than for District delegates. Should you have any questions please feel free to contact headquarters. We are here to assist you!

EMAIL — Do you want to receive *Our Two Cents* on email? Send an email to secretary@texasvfwaux.org with subject Our Two Cents and you will receive it in your personal email. You may also get other flyers for events that apply to all auxiliary members throughout the year. But you will not be spammed.

AUDITS!!!—When completing an audit there cannot be any NEGATIVE balance on a line item. Should you find there is a negative you must move the funds from General fund to that line item. Do not spend money in DUES that you have not already received. If you are paying for a member's dues by vote of the auxiliary then it comes from General fund or from Relief Fund depending on the circumstances.
