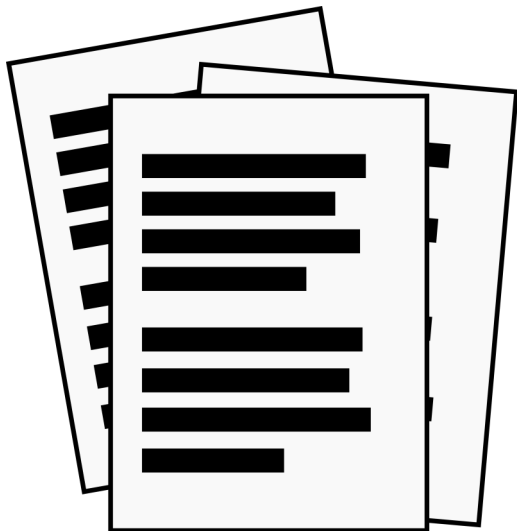

I've had several people reach out to me recently about their Facebook page being flagged by Meta and taken down as a SPAM Page. I'm glad that y'all are working on getting your pages set up to expand our organization's reach, but it does suck to do all the work of building a page for it to get taken down. The common problem I've found with all of these is personalization, or lack of it really. All of these pages have been made using the resources found on MALTA. That's not to say these Auxiliaries did anything wrong or that MALTA doesn't have good resources. MALTA is always a great place to start!

But... If we have 5 people within a 500 mile radius all building pages with the exact same profile pictures, exact same page descriptions, and exact same content, it's easy to understand how an AI computer system can think that they're fake. How do we solve this? Personalization!

Examples...Let's go! Instead of making your profile picture the classic Auxiliary logo, you could make it a picture of your VFW Namesake, your Auxiliary at an event, or even the Auxiliary logo with your Post number added underneath. This way, it's not the exact same picture as everyone else across the country. When you're making your posts and promoting programs such as membership and scholarships (those are big ones you should be promoting online!), you can start with the wording from MALTA if you want, but make it your own! Create your post the way you would on your personal page, while remembering to speak in the 3rd person and represent your Auxiliary as a whole. Use emojis. Have fun with it!

If you're struggling to set up your page, I'm always an email or text away. I do work (and gas is not cheap!), so I might not be able to come sit down with you in person, but I'm always willing to set up a video chat to look at your computer screen or text me pictures of your issue. I do not mind helping you from ground zero and building your page with you. I look forward to getting our system online growing even more!

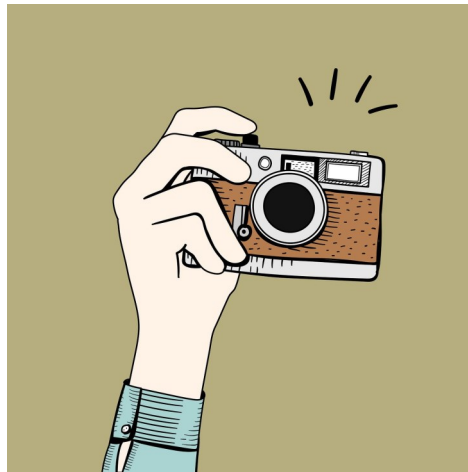
